Your doctor is there to help you make the best decisions for your health. Be sure to ask any questions or seek a second opinion if needed. It's important to be well-informed and comfortable with your gyn-onc and your treatment plan. These questions should help you have a clear conversation with your doctor about your care.

- What is your role? How are you different from a regular medical oncologist?
- What are your qualifications and experience in treating ovarian cancer?
- Will you be in charge of my treatment or will there be a team involved? Who will be on that team?
- What tests or procedures will I need to have done to understand my condition? How will these tests be done?
- Can you explain my treatment plan and schedule and what to expect at each step?
- Are you covered by my insurance?
- Can you explain the costs of treatment and any financial help available?
- How often will I need to see you for check-ups and follow-up care?
- How can I reach you or your team if I have questions?
