## **Questions to Ask Your Doctor:** The Gynecologic Oncologist's Role in Your Care

Your doctor is there to help you make the best decisions for your health. Be sure to ask any questions or seek a second opinion if needed. It's important to be well-informed and comfortable with your gyn-onc and your treatment plan. These questions should help you have a clear conversation with your doctor about your care.

	<ul> <li>What tests or procedures will I need to have done to understand my condition? How will these tests be done?</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Can you explain my treatment plan and schedule and what to expect at each step?</li> </ul>
	Are you covered by my insurance?

How can I reach you or your team if I have questions?
